lucet: it is light, it is day

\***lucent**: (adj.) shining, bright

\***lucid**: (adj.) shining, bright, clear, easily understood, (**lucidity**) *(The old man moved further into a state of Alzheimer's and became less lucid.)*

\***Lucifer**: (n.) the fallen angel, the devil (ferro = to carry)

pater: father

\***patricide**: (n.) the act of murdering or killing one's father

\***paternity**: (n.) fatherhood, the state of being a father (**paternal**)

\***patrician**: (n.) of noble birth, aristocratic, or royalty

\***paterfamilias**: (n.) male head of a household or family (**patriarch**)

mater: mother

\***matricide**: (n.) the act of murdering or killing one's mother

\***maternity**: (n.) motherhood, the state of being a mother (**maternal**)

\***materfamilias**: (n.) female head of a household or family (**matriarch**)

omnes: all

\***omnipresent**: (adj.) being present / everywhere at the same time *(Facebook is really omnipresent, as you can locate users all over the world.)*

\***omnivorous**: (adj.) eating any sort or type of food (**omnivore**)

\***omnipotent**: (adj.) having unlimited power/authority, all-powerful (**omnipotence**)  
*(Many feel that Superman is omnipotent, but that is false as he has a deadly fear kryptonite, which can destroy him.)*

\***omniscient**: (adj.) all-knowing *(God is omniscient, as he knows everything.)*

purgat: he / she cleans

\***purgatory**: (n.) a place for a temporary punishment or cleansing

\***purge**: (v.t.) to cleanse, get rid of or rid of impurities or waste materials (or sin)

strenue: strenuously, hard

\***strenuous**: (adj.) zealous, with great effort, energy, requiring hard work

reprehendit: he / she blames, scolds, reprehends

\***reprehend**: (v.t.) to reprimand, to scold, to blame (reprehension) *(The hockey coach angrily reprehended his player for having taken a stupid penalty with one minute left in a game, which was tied 2-2.)*

docet: he / she teaches

\***doctorate**: (n.) the highest degree awarded by a university

\***docile**: (adj.) easily taught, easy to discipline **indocile**: (adj.) not easily taught

\***doctrine**: (n.) something taught, teachings

curare: to look after, to take care of

\***curator**: (n.) in charge of a museum, a library or exhibit (eg. Smithsonian)

\***curative**: (adj.) for the curing of a disease, something which heals

\***elucidate**: (v.t.) to shed light on something, to explain, to clarify (*The math teacher elucidated the calculus problem to the confused student.*)

\***translucent**: (adj.) light can pass or shine through, partially transparent

pater: father

\***patrimony**: (n.) an inheritance from one's father or ancestor, heritage

\***patronize**: (v.t.) to act as a patron, to treat in a condescending or rude manner (*The arrogant and nasty teacher patronized and mocked the student for having asked a question.*)

\***patrilineal**: (adj.) tracing one's kinship, one's family through the father

mater: mother

\***matrilineal**: (adj.) tracing one's kinship, one's family through the mother

\***matrix**: (n.) of the womb, uterus; that in which anything takes form

\***matriculate**: (v.t./i.) to enroll, especially as a student in a college / university (*In 1975, Mr. Fortier matriculated at Bowdoin College and became an official Polar Bear.*)

ancilla: slavewoman

\***ancillary**: (adj.) secondary, subordinate, of secondary importance (*The governor acknowledged that the issue of Whoopie Pies as the state dessert was a minor one, and of ancillary importance.*)

omnes: all

\***omnifarious**: (adj.) of all kinds, varieties and forms

purgat: he / she cleans

\***expurgate**: (v.t.) to delete, expunge, remove obscene and objectionable passages

reprehendit: he / she blames, scolds, reprehends

\***reprehensible**: (adj.) deserving to be blamed, worthy of blame (*The student's decision to play video games all night long, on the eve of taking the SATs, was a reprehensible act.*)

docet: he / she teaches

\***indoctrinate**: (v.t.) to instruct, imbue or fill with doctrines or beliefs (*The Celtics fans tried to indoctrinate Kobe Bryant with a love of the Celtics.*)

\***doctrinaire**: (adj.) stubbornly adhering or clinging to a doctrine or belief (*The politician was very doctrinaire and refused to deal with members of the other party, thus further polarizing the political climate.*)

curare: to look after, to take care of

\***procure**: (v.t.) to obtain, or to secure supplies by great effort (**procurer**) (*The doctor procured medication from the drug company, and planned on using the anti-biotics in his inner-city clinic.*)
